On Saturday, August 25, 2012, more than 140 people gathered on the Arms of Hope Boles Campus for the ground breaking of the Paul and Mary Lou Winkler Hospitality Center. Each year the Boles Campus has over 1,000 visitors, mostly volunteers, many of whom will now stay in this facility upon its completion. These visitors include church, college, business and other volunteer groups or families of our residents, who visit the Boles Campus and need a place to stay. The

new 6,200 square foot building will have four bunkrooms and four hotel rooms. There will be a common area for games, activities and relaxation. There will also be an apartment for a hospitality center director. The building will be located

> in close proxlimity to Arms



The Dallas Family Outreach Center assists poverty stricken families who are in desperate need of physical, emotional and spiritual services. Currently in the Dallas area, with plans to expand to other urban areas in Texas, Arms of Hope Family Outreach Centers provide an opportunity to connect with resources to help families deal with hardships and life's challenges that often stress a family to the point where they need hope, restoration and guidance to find a path towards success and independence.

The Duncanville Campus is a new urban application of Arms of Hope's Together Program which serves single-mother families in the DFW area. The program helps motivated single mothers and their children, who are fleeing poverty, homelessness, abuse and neglect, transition into successful, independent futures. Arms of Hope creates an environment for amazing transformations by teaching parenting skills, enabling education opportunities and providing career training and a home in a peaceful, safe environment.



#### **Duncanville Campus Reception**

The reception for the Together Program Urban Project in Duncanville was held Thursday evening, October 23rd. Those who attended were able to visit with others interested in serving single-mother families. A tour of the apartment complex was provided to the visitors by several of the single mothers and their children who participate in the program. The families living in the Arms of Hope's Duncanville Together Program's urban project are provided housing, utilities, case management services, worship, work and educational opportunities, counseling and, above all, hope!





#### Family Outreach Center Reception

Arms of Hope celebrated the opening of its new Family Outreach Center in Dallas. Working in partnership with the Highland Oaks Church, the FOC is an extension of the Outreach Ministry Program and to date has served over 100 individuals in desperate need. 

















# BETTER TO GIVE THAN TO RECEIVE







Arms of Hope-Medina Campus residents and employees volunteer at the Utopia Animal Rescue Ranch (a non-profit organization that primarily rescues dogs). The ranch was cofounded in 1998 by Kinky Friedman, Nancy Parker Simons and Tony Simons. They currently have 51 rescued dogs and their goal is to have loving families adopt these animals. These dogs have

been abandoned, abused and neglected and the time our kids spend with them helps socialize the dogs, making them more adoptable. Our residents and employees served by winterizing dog houses, repairing fences and pens, clearing brush and most importantly, providing love for these animals.

On Thanksgiving, they even gave

up part of their holiday to help prepare and serve each dog a special meal. Future projects include building and painting new dog houses, cleaning and enhancing the walking paths to aid in working with the animals. What an incredible way for our residents to give back to their community and share the common bond of the love that they have received! A New Life and a Second Chance By Sherrie Walton, Together Program Resident

My name is Sherrie Walton and I'm a 29 year old single mother to Collin (11), Sarah (9) and Jayden (5). I am a resident in the Together Program at the Arms of Hope-Boles Campus. I was born in Virginia in a traumatic way. My mother had an emergency C-section because my dad was beating her. We lived in a bread truck because my dad was on the run from the law, due to kidnapping my half sister from her mother. I grew up very poor and my dad never had a secure job. I didn't even start school until the age of nine. I was physically, emotionally, sexually abused and neglected. My dad was also abusive to my mom and my siblings. I finished the 6th grade when I was 16 years old and then dropped out because I got married and became pregnant. After four months of marriage, we divorced. I then became pregnant with Collin. His father left me because he didn't want a child. Sarah's father left me when I was six weeks along in the pregnancy. Jayden's father asked me to get an abortion but I moved in with family mem-

bers. I applied to the Together Program because I was going to be homeless and I was afraid of losing everything. I had stayed with my grandfather in Virginia, but it lasted only three months. He was verbally and physically abusive to my

children. I then stayed with a cousin in North Carolina, but it was a two bedroom house with seven people living there with alcohol and strangers coming and going. I was accepted into the Together Program in January, 2012.

I feel free to excel as a result of the emotional support I receive from the Together Program. Because of Arms of Hope, I'm able to pursue a degree in nursing. My children are excelling in school and have gotten involved in sports. I have gotten off my depression medications and feel safe enough to get close to my children and become a real family. I have been able to access counseling services which have allowed me to accept my past and move forward. I feel that I found God and I enjoy being a member of a church family.

Without Arms of Hope, at best I would have been living from place to place, but now I am able to have stability and confidence to thrive. I plan to finish my degree and pursue a career in nursing so I can support my children and become independent. One of my dreams is to go on mission trips to spread the Word of God. Because of Arms of Hope, I am able to live in a stable environment where I can continue to strive and reach for my dreams.

# Finding Family and Hope at Arms of Hope By Jaemesha Rogers, Residential Child Care Resident

My name is Jaemesha Rogers and I'm a 14 year old resident at Arms of Hope-Boles Campus. I arrived 4 years ago along with my older brother after our cousins decided not to adopt us into their family. I was 10 years old and my brother was only 15 years old. Needless to say, it dramatically affected my view of life. Before that, we had lived with my single mother and grandfather in a two bedroom trailer. It barely qualified as a house. My mother was a drug addict, was rarely home and, with my grandfather working, my brother and I were often abandoned. The longer my mother was gone, the closer my brother and I became. He was my role model and our relationship grew closer every day. I knew I could always trust him to love and take care of me. After that, we lived in five different Child Protective Services (CPS) placements.

Coming to Arms of Hope-Boles Campus was the best thing that ever happened to us! I was provided a home with a bed of my own, food that I can trust will always be there, incredible friends, a spiritual family that I can trust and rely on and I have been provided with the opportunity to set a good example for others. My brother now attends college and he's making a difference in people's lives by sharing from the lessons he learned from our past. After having to play the role of parent in my life, he is now getting to explore his own spiritual path. Living at Arms of Hope-Boles Campus has given me so many opportunities and after going through fourteen years of moving from place to place, my sponsor has asked to legally adopt me! Arms of Hope has given me the family that God intended me to have because I know that He has



Guests enjoyed hearing Former First Lady Laura Bush speak on behalf of Arms of Hope. Dan Branch, Member of the Texas House of Representatives, welcomed the attendees in the Dallas Hilton Anatole ballroom. Wade Hodges gave the invocation and Don Crisp, Arms of Hope board member, reminisced on the wonderful history of Boles and Medina. He announced the opening of Arms of Hope's Duncanville campus and introduced a mom and her daughter who reside at the new campus. Mr. Crisp also spoke about

the recent opening of Arms of Hope's Family Outreach Center in Dallas, which strives to help families in financial stress. Finally, Crisp announced that Arms of Hope's former CEO, Kevin McDonald, had stepped down to have better access to medical care for his daughter, Marlie Ruth, who was born with a brain tumor. Crisp went on to explain that McDonald continues to serve on the Arms of Hope board of directors and his wife, Nathalie, has been newly appointed as Arms of Hope's Chief Development Officer.

The crowd heard stories from residents Michael, Sarah and Julia. Their touching stories helped the audience learn how important not only their support is, but how much their assistance is needed to continue to help at-risk children and single-mother families.

Laura Bush gracefully approached the microphone, where she gave comical updates on her family members, topping it off by stating that Mr. and Mrs. Bush are happy to be back in Texas living what she calls the afterlife in a state that George calls the "promised land!" She was quick to state that she wasn't there to speak about their lives out of the public eye, but instead she was excited to talk about the great organization that all were there to celebrate - Arms of Hope. She explained how "thousands of children have benefited from the care and compassion they have received over the years from Arms of Hope's facilities." She continued to tell the story of Alex and Andrew, two brothers in Arms of Hope's care, who have overcome homelessness, poverty, abuse and neglect. Mrs. Bush stated, "children need to know that they are valued and that someone believes in them and that their success matters. AOH provides children with the compassionate support of caring adults." In her closing remarks, Mrs. Bush asked the audience to consider how they could support the ministries of Arms of Hope. "Volunteer, be a mentor for a child who needs you. Donate household items, clothing and baby items to support single moth-



Arms of Hope is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit Christian organization that was formed by the consolidation of Medina Children's Home (est. 1958) and Boles Children's Home (est. 1924). This partnership holds over 135 years of combined experience in caring for the financial, physical and emotional needs of children and single-mother families. Although both organizations were originally created to serve as homes for orphans, Arms of Hope has expanded to serve the growing needs of at-risk children and families. Arms of Hope offers residential and outreach programs for children and single-mother families who are fleeing poverty, homelessness, abuse and neglect.

All figures in this report are based on the Fiscal Year from 7/1/11 to 6/30/12.

Arms of Hope is blessed to have a Board of Directors with an incredible level of knowledge to provide strong leadership and guidance for the organization. Under the direction of the board, Arms of Hope's leadership team is in constant pursuit of improving and increasing the support provided to children and single-mother families who are struggling throughout the state of Texas and beyond. All employees are committed to minimizing administrative expenses to save as much as possible for each of Arms of Hope's programs.

Arms of Hope's annual budget is \$10 million and the organization depends almost entirely on private donations from generous individuals, corporations, foundations and churches for funding.









The majority of Arms of Hope's program participants are from Texas and a significant number come from Dallas/Fort Worth, San Antonio, Houston, East Texas and surrounding areas. Individuals of all ethnic backgrounds are welcomed with open arms into Arms of Hope's care. Children and young adults participating in Arms of Hope's programs range in age from birth to early twenties. The largest population of children in Arms of Hope's care are between six and twelve years old. Less than 5% of Arms of Hope's residents come from homes with two parents. Most placements are a result of failed adoptions, grandparents who can no longer take on parental responsibility, single-parent homes













filled with abuse and neglect, or placements by the Juvenile Probation Office. Arms of Hope encourages residents to become successful along their "plan of service." 87% have better grades in school than when they first arrived in Arms of Hope's care. 84% of Arms of Hope's school-aged children participate in extracurricular activities, such as sports, cheerleading, band, FFA, school clubs and scholastic events. 86% of residents

from all campus programs either experience positive reunification with their family or graduate from one of Arms of Hope's programs. 100% of the children who come to Arms of Hope with their single mothers are considered to be homeless. Arms of Hope is truly making a difference in the lives of individuals by providing programs to help meet the needs of those who crave hope for a better life.

All campus residents receive professional therapy. In the 2012 Fiscal Year, 5,060 hours of professional therapy were utilized by Arms of Hope residents.







#### RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE PROGRAM



In 2012, 48% made "spiritual progress" by seeking spiritual leadership roles on campus and were selected to attend Leadership Camp.

The Residential Child Care Program meets disadvantaged children's physical, emotional, educational and spiritual needs in a warm family-like atmosphere where house parents function as mother and father figures. Resi-


dents range in age from 5 to 18 and live in cottages with eight to ten children. Arms of Hope provides for children's basic daily needs including shelter, food, clothing, counseling, supervision and education.

### COLLEGE & CAREER PROGRAM



The College and Career Program provides assistance for Arms of Hope high school graduates with support through college, trade school or into their first job and often includes accommodations for graduates who have not yet found a place to call home.

#### TOGETHER PROGRAM (BOLES, DUNCANVILLE & MEDINA)



The Together Program helps motivated single mothers and their children transition into success-

ful, independent futures by providing counseling, accountability, parenting skills, career training and a

home in a peaceful and safe environment. These mothers are fleeing homelessness, domestic violence, abuse or have lost sustainable support when a death, incarceration or divorce have occurred and there are no other means of provision. Arms of Hope has also begun adding urban applications of its Together Program by opening a campus in Duncanville, Texas, and has plans to open additional Together Program campuses in other urban areas across the state.

#### **OUTREACH PROGRAM**



The Outreach Program provides assistance to underprivileged youth in their own neighborhoods, which are some of the most financially distressed areas in Texas communities including San Antonio, Dallas and Houston. Arms of Hope hosts youth events featuring inspirational speakers and sponsors Christian-based sports teams, which provide the opportunity to mentor and build positive relationships with at-risk children.

The Family Outreach Program connects underprivileged families seeking assistance with necessities including food, clothing, financial assistance and counseling until they are stabilized in a residential program.


